# How the REF works



REF assesses the quality of research in participating UK universities, in all disciplines. It is carried out by 34 expert panels, grouped into 4 main panels.

Main Panel A: Medicine, health and life sciences

Main Panel B: Physical sciences, engineering and mathematics

Main panel C: Social sciences

Main Panel D: Arts and humanities

#### 2017-19

#### Preparation

Panels were appointed. Guidance and criteria were published.

### 2019-21

#### Submissions

Universities made submissions. REF put on hold for four months, in response to covid.

#### 2021-22

#### Assessment

34 expert panels reviewed the submissions, guided by the 4 main panels.

# Press briefing details

- Press will be asked not to contact HEIs until after the press briefing (i.e. from late morning 11 May 2022)
- Embargo period ends 00.01 12 May 2022

# Receiving your results



- Available through the submission system to your HEI's authorised submitters
- Individual HEI results available from 9.00am on 9 May, 2022 with comparative data
- All HEI results available (under embargo) from 9.00am on 10 May, 2022
- Both sets of results will be available in a spreadsheet in the format in which you received your dummy data.

# Individual results



- Filename will be ResultsXXXXX.xlsx with your HEI's UKPRN in the filename
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# % of eligible staff submitted

• The % eligible indicates the proportion made up by staff returned to the exercise out of the total staff meeting the core eligibility criteria:

**REF**2021

- In REF 2021 it was a requirement for HEIs to return all staff with significant responsibility for research
- These staff would in many cases have been identified by contractual status alone (including staff with R-only and T and R contracts) as defined in the core eligibility criteria; where this was the case, the % eligible submitted = 100%
- However, where these criteria identified staff who did not have significant responsibility for research, the institution could run a process to identify who, among their staff meeting the core eligibility criteria, had significant responsibility for research.
- The % of eligible staff submitted is calculated as
  - The total FTE of all eligible staff submitted as a percentage of the total FTE of all eligible staff identified
- and rounded to the nearest 5% and capped and 100%

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# **Comparative data**



- Provided to HEIs with own results on 9<sup>th</sup> May
- Will include, by UOA, main panel and for UK sector:
  - Average profiles (FTE-weighted)
  - Quartiles
  - For overall and sub-profiles
- Will be published on REF website with results on 12<sup>th</sup> May

# Responsible REF results



- The REF team <u>do not</u> provide rankings or hierarchies of results
- REF logo policy
  - Full details on the REF website
  - We would <u>not</u> expect the REF logo to be used to imply endorsement of any rankings or hierarchies
  - Can be used on external and internal comms about participation in REF 2021 and the results
  - Should generally be used on specific comms about REF, rather than on homepages etc. where use of the logo may look like endorsement or partnership
  - REF logo should not be the most prominent feature in order to avoid confusion over authorship of content comms still need your HEI branding
- Approaching REF panel members for comment
  - They are only allowed to discuss material already in the public domain
  - They cannot comment on scores for individual outputs/ICS or on who assessed particular items
  - They cannot comment on ranking of UOAs, submissions, HEIs or anything else the REF <u>does</u> <u>not</u> provide rankings
- HEIs should ensure they are familiar with CMA guidelines
